13	A paper plate decorated to look like your favourite person.
14	A magic wand made from a stick (max length 30cm)
15	An animal made using a collage of natural materials (A4)

CLASS	Juniors A (Children in Reception, Year1 and Year2)
16	An original watercolour painting of an animal in the style of Beatrix Potter (A4)
17	Handwriting with illustration "Incy Wincy Spider" – see below (A4)
18	Using computer art, create an image of a superhero (A4)
19	A self-portrait – this could be painted, collaged or drawn using pastels or crayons (A4)
